## HISTORY OF THE IVY

In 1889, John Gilman, prosperous banker and industrialist, commissioned a mansion in Mount Vernon, Baltimore's most prestigious neighborhood. He chose architect Charles Carson for the job, a master of design who had recently completed Baltimore Grand Masonic Venue and the opulent Methodist Church. Gilman asked Carson to build him a house to speak of wealth, power and taste, from its inlaid floors to its turreted slate roof. But Gilman also wanted a home. Its rooms should be intimate, its fireplaces welcoming, and its tall windows should frame the charming streetscape.

The mansion was raised on the leafy corner of Biddle and North Calvert Streets, neighbored on all sides by handsome brick and stone residences. But as fate would have it, Gilman did not live to enjoy his new home, dying suddenly just before the house was complete. Mrs. Gilman lived at the the Biddle Street mansion for several years, then sold it to a man named William Painter, and his amiable wife, Harriet. William was a wildly successful inventor, a holder of more than 100 patents, and the founder and president of the Crown Cork & Seal Co., manufacturer of bottle caps, corks and closures of all kinds.





The Painters were very sociable and philanthropic, hosting luncheons and bridge parties, dedicating parks and statues. The Painters and their three children divided their time between the house on Biddle Street and an opulent summer home in Guilford. Father and son were great fans of the work of Baltimore native Edgar Allan Poe, and made sure to send birthday flowers to his grave every year.

When William passed on, Harriet built a children's hospital in his name in the city. Soon afterwards, she sold the mansion to the Futchers family. Dr. Futchers was a Canadian physician, a noted diagnostician recruited to join Johns Hopkins, and he set up office and family in the Biddle Street house. The Futchers lived and worked there quietly for years. The Great Depression rolled in, the neighborhood changed, and the mansion was bought by Robert Garrett, longtime chairman of the Baltimore Parks and Recreation Department, who in turn gave it to the city for the department's offices. Finally, in the early 1980s, Mayor William Schaefer decided to use the empty – but still beautiful – house for hosting visiting dignitaries.

Today, after an extraordinary update and total rehabilitation, the house is as grand and glorious as ever: garlanded in ivy, high windows shining, turrets rising above the trees and gardens blossoming below. The attention lavished upon it more than a century ago by architect Charles Carson is today evident at every turn, from its Tiffany-leaded glass windows to its carved wood wainscoting, 23 individual fireplaces, green marble mined from local quarries, and a magnificent central staircase that climbs three stories past stained glass toward the radiance of the original skylights at the top, like an ascent to heaven.

## **SWIMMING**


Swimming pool access is available at the nearby Merritt Downtown Athletic Club, approximately a half mile from The Ivy Hotel. A \$25 pass allows visitors one day use of the entire facility, which also includes squash, racquetball and basketball courts in addition to workout equipment of all kinds.





## RECOMMENDED WALKS AND RUNS

Below you will find a map outlining our suggested jogging route from The Ivy Hotel. This route is approximately 2.4 miles (3.8 km) and can be easily modified. It will take walkers or runners south toward the Inner Harbor via N. Charles Street and returns them to the hotel heading north via Calvert Street. Please note that the route south slopes downhill toward the Inner Harbor, so that the return back to the hotel is mostly uphill.



For longer runs, we recommend the 5.2 mile flat brick-lined promenade around the Inner Harbor, from which you can enjoy views of boats and water. The mileage can be increased by running down each of the piers. Early morning or evening are the best times to avoid crowds, especially in the summer.

Another shorter option is to walk or run west on Biddle Street, turning left on North Charles Street and continuing down to the Washington Monument, then left again to return to the hotel via Calvert Street. This path is approximately 1.3 miles (2.1 km).



### THERMOSTAT CONTROLS

Our state-of-the-art HVAC System constantly circulates fresh air into the hotel. To change the room temperature either warmer or cooler, it works best to increase not more than three degrees at a time. For instance, if the temperature in the room is 72 degrees as in the picture below, and you would like it to be, say, 78, please set it to 75, and when the room reaches that temperature, increase it another three degrees.

Please use the red upward facing arrow to increase the room temperature.  
To decrease the room temperature, please use the blue downward facing arrow.



### LIGHTING

The top button on the light switch pad will control all of the applications in a particular room. Individual lights controls can be found beneath that button to allow you to adjust your room to your ideal setting.



## IN-ROOM SAFE

All of our guest rooms are equipped with a safe which can be locked with a secure code chosen by you.

To operate the safe:

Step 1: Press the “Reset” button located in the lower left corner of the key pad.


Step 2: Enter the 4 digit code of your choosing (please remember the code you have entered)

Step 3: Press the “Lock” button located in the lower right corner of the key pad. The safe is now locked and your 4 digit code will be needed to open it.

Step 4: To open the safe, key in your 4 digit code, and the safe door will open.

Step 5: The safe will remain responsive to this 4 digit code until the “Reset” button is pressed.

## ART

### AMERICAN VISIONARY ART MUSEUM

### THE BALTIMORE MUSEUM OF ART

Visitors to the BMA can enjoy extraordinary exhibits of 19th-century, modern, and contemporary art. Founded in 1914, the Baltimore Museum of Art features the internationally renowned Cone Collection - artworks collected by the Cone sisters during their time in Europe in the early 20th century, and which includes the world's largest number of works by Henri Matisse. While there, visit the Sculpture Garden and Gertrude's Restaurant specializing in Chesapeake Bay cuisine. Admission is free, although there may be a charge for some special exhibits.

### THE GEORGE PEABODY LIBRARY

The Peabody Library, though it houses a 19th century-focused research library of Johns Hopkins University, is primarily an architectural destination for most visitors. Opened in 1878, the strikingly impressive Stack Room consists of five tiers of ornamental cast-iron balconies rising dramatically over sixty feet to the skylight, in jaw-droppingly beautiful Renaissance Revival style. ### WALTERS ART MUSEUM

A short walk from The Ivy is an world-renowned collection of thousands of treasures ranging from the 3,000 B.C. to early 20th century Europe, a collection amassed by father and son William and Henry Walters, who bequeathed the mansion and its contents to the city. Noted collections include Egyptian, Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Ethiopian, and western Medieval art, antiquities and artifacts, as well as Renaissance and Asian art. ### MARYLAND SCIENCE CENTER

## **HISTORY**

### BALTIMORE & OHIO RAILROAD MUSEUM

A National Historic Monument, the forty acre campus is on the site of the birthplace of American railroading, where the first commercial long distance tracks were laid. It houses the oldest and most complete collection of American railroad artifacts in the world, including locomotives, rolling stock, exhibits and historic buildings. Combination tickets are available to Ellicott City Station in Ellicott City, and Mount Clare Museum House, the oldest colonial Georgian house in the city.

### FORT MCHENRY NATIONAL MONUMENT & HISTORIC SHRINE

Discover the 18th century brick fort where the battle occurred that served as inspiration for the American National Anthem. Now part of the National Parks Service, Fort McHenry was vital during the War of 1812, protecting Baltimore’s Inner Harbor from a British invasion in 1814. Imprisoned on a ship in the harbor, attorney Francis Scott Key watched the bombardment and wrote a poem commemorating the American triumph. Daily activities include participatory demonstrations led by park rangers.

### HISTORIC SHIPS OF THE INNER HARBOR

### ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS

Any time of year is a great time to visit Camden Yards, home to Baltimore's MLB team, the Orioles. Situated near the Inner Harbor, it opened in 1992, and was the first 'retro' ballpark and still the most highly praised of the baseball-only stadiums. Rather than demolish a long narrow 19th century B&O warehouse adjacent to the park, the building was incorporated into the design and now houses offices, service areas, and a private club. ### HOWARD PETERS RAWLINGS CONSERVATORY & BOTANIC GARDENS

Located in Druid Hill Park, the Conservatory is an appealing destination for visitors any time of year. The splendid, soaring 1886 Palm House was designed by the noted architect George A. Frederick, who also designed Baltimore City Hall. It is the last in a series of conservatories that once existed in every Baltimore City park, and is the second oldest surviving glass botanic conservatory in the US. Two pavilions added in 2002 contain the Orchid Room, and the Mediterranean, Tropical, and Desert Houses.
